E-CYCLE WISCONSIN

Recycle electronics instead of trashing them after September 1

Cell phones, computers, televisions and other electronics are a daily part of most of our lives. But the more electronics we use, the more electronic waste we create. Electronic waste is the fastest growing component of waste in the United States. There are millions of pounds of electronic waste in Wisconsin alone.

Until now, Wisconsin households could throw away their outdated or broken electronics. But trashing electronics is not without consequences. Electronics can contain harmful chemicals like mercury, lead, cadmium and other heavy metals, as well as chemical flame retardants. When disposed of improperly, these pollutants can pose a risk to human and environmental health.

Electronics also contain valuable reusable materials, including steel, gold, silver, copper and glass. Properly recycling these materials reduces the need for mining new materials.

"Electronics are resources that are too valuable to waste, and we can help both our economy and the environment by recycling them," said Ann Coakley, director of Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Waste and Materials Management Program.

Under a new electronics recycling law, passed in October 2009, Wisconsinites now have the opportunity to recycle their electronics instead of trashing them. The E-Cycle Wisconsin program, created under the law by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR), provides electronics

recycling options in many parts of the state and bans the landfilling of certain electronic devices as of September 1, 2010.

The following electronics can be recycled through E-Cycle Wisconsin:

- Computers (desktop, laptop, netbooks and tablet computers)
- Desktop printers (including those that scan, fax and/or copy)
- Computer monitors
- Televisions
- DVD players, VCRs and DVRs
- Fax machines
- Computer mice and keyboards
- Other computer accessories such as hard drives, speakers, flash drives and modems

All of these devices, along with cell phones, are banned from Wisconsin landfills and incinerators as of September 1st. For more information on the E-Cycle Wisconsin program, including a full list of collection sites, visit the Department of Natural Resources website at

CITY OF GLENDALE FALL LEAF COLLECTION

The City of Glendale will once again pick up leaves beginning early in October through November 13, 2010 (contingent upon the weather) provided the following procedures are followed:

1. Leaves raked to the curb and gutter, and road shoulder areas by November 13th will be collected by the City of Glendale Department of Public Works.
2. Leaves placed on City right-of-ways for City pickup should be raked in long narrow piles that are within reach of the leaf vacuum tube.
3. Piles should not extend into traffic lanes, thereby creating traffic hazards.
4. Leaves should not be placed around obstacles such as mail box posts, sign posts and light poles.
5. Crews will not pick up leaves mixed with debris, logs, branches, rocks, plastic, metal or glass containers or any other type of refuse.
6. Leaves should not be placed on City cul-de-sacs, vacant land or City property except on the public right-of-way along the curb and gutter, and road shoulder areas.

Roadways with Curbs and Gutters: Leaves should be placed on the pavement on the roadside of the curb. To prevent street flooding, do not place leaves on top of storm sewer grates.

Roadways with Shoulders: Leaves should be placed on the shoulder of the road and not extend into the roadway.

Roadways with Ditches: Leaves should be placed no farther than 4 feet from the edge of the pavement, but in no event shall they extend into the water flow line of the ditch.

Alley Collection: Leaf collection will no longer be made from "dead end" or "no outlet" alleys.

Electronic Devices

Beginning September 1, 2010, Veolia Environmental Services will charge \$25.00 to pick up televisions, VCRs, DVDs, DVRs and other video players and fax machines, due to the new electronics recycling law. Veolia will not pick up computers.

Please call Veolia Environmental Services at (262)679-0860 to arrange for pick-up of any appliances. There is no extra charge unless the appliance contains freon. The cost is \$30.00 for the following appliances: refrigerator, freezer, air conditioner, dehumidifier and microwave (recovery process required for microwave because of mercury in the thermostat).

Fall Maintenance - Mailboxes

Please check your mailbox posts to ensure that they are solid and sturdy in the ground prior to winter. Once winter is upon us and the ground is frozen, it is almost impossible to make the needed repairs to sturdy your mailbox. This will ensure that when heavy snow is plowed off the road, your mailbox will not be pushed over.

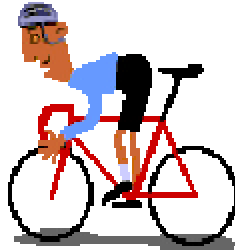

BICYCLE LICENSES AVAILABLE

City of Glendale Ordinance provides that any bicycle ridden on the street is to be licensed. Licenses are available at the Glendale Police Department and sell for a fee of \$10.00. This license is **PERMANENT**.



REMINDER - COLLECTION OF REFUSE

Per City of Glendale Ordinance 8-3-6, all garbage shall be placed at the curbside collection point only after 4:00 p.m. on the evening prior to the regular collection time, and then all refuse containers must be removed from the curbside collection point within twenty-four (24) hours after the regular collection time.

FORECLOSURES...A Rising Concern

Foreclosures are fast becoming a major issue for cities around the nation, including Glendale. While most numbers are staggering, Glendale has fared very well when compared with national, state and regional foreclosure rates. These properties are often abandoned by their owners without the City or neighbors having any knowledge. Usually, the first clue comes from a call by a neighbor concerned about the general appearance of the yard or perhaps some suspicious activity.

The City of Glendale Inspection Department is asking residents to notify them of any known foreclosed properties. The City tries to maintain a list of known foreclosed properties and uses this information to track property maintenance complaints.

Residents are also asked to notify the City if any of the following conditions are present:

- Sidewalks not cleared of snow & ice
- Lawn or weeds uncut for long periods
- Hazardous trees or limbs
- Damaged or deteriorated condition of exterior such as paint, roofing, windows, shutters and doors
- Uncollected piles of trash or discarded items in yard area
- Noticeable animal activity in or around buildings (raccoons, squirrels, skunks or other rodents)
- Open windows or doors
- Recent damage to property
- Running water or noticeable moisture or steam on interior side of any window
- Suspicious persons or activity (Call the Police Non-Emergency line at 228-1753)

In some cases, the City may maintain the lawn and yard areas if necessary to maintain the general appearance of the property.

By notifying the City of any of the above conditions, we can attempt to contact a person or party responsible for the property to notify them of any necessary repairs or corrective action.

Protect Yourself with Flood Insurance

Just a few inches of water from a flood can cause tens of thousands of dollars in damage. Over the past ten years, the average flood claim has amounted to over \$33,000. Flood insurance is the best way to protect yourself from devastating financial loss.

Flood insurance is available to homeowners, renters, condominium owners and renters, and commercial owners/renters in the City of Glendale. Costs vary depending on how much insurance is purchased, what it covers, and the property's flood risk.

All policy forms provide coverage for buildings and contents. However, you might want to discuss insuring personal property with your agent, since contents coverage is optional. Typically, there's a 30-day waiting period - from date of purchase - before your policy goes into effect. The average flood insurance policy costs less than \$570.00 a year...that means now is the best time to buy flood insurance.

Halloween Safety Tips

It's almost time for witches, ghosts and goblins to appear at parties and on neighborhood streets in search of fun and treats. In order to make the Halloween holiday safe, the North Shore Fire Department recommends the following tips:

- Purchase only costumes, wigs and props labeled flame-resistant or flame-retardant.
- Dried flowers, cornstalks and crepe paper are highly flammable.
- Use flashlights when illuminating Jack-o'-lanterns.
- Keep exits clear of decorations, ensuring nothing blocks escape routes.
- Use flashlights as alternatives to candles or torch lights when decorating walkways and yards.
- Instruct children to stay away from open flames or other heat sources. Be sure children know how to stop, drop and roll in the event their clothing catches fire. (**Stop** immediately, **drop** to the ground, covering your face with your hands, and **roll** over and over to extinguish flames.)
- Provide children with lightweight flashlights to carry for lighting or as part of their costumes.

FAIR HOUSING - IT'S THE LAW!

It is the policy of the City of Glendale to assure equal opportunity to live in adequate housing facilities regardless of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, sex, handicap, sexual preference, marital status of persons maintaining a household, lawful source of income, place of birth, or age, and to that end, to prohibit discrimination in housing by any persons.

In connection with any real estate transaction which affects any housing accommodation on the open market, or in connection with any public sale, purchase, rental or lease of any accommodation, it is illegal within Glendale for a person, owner, financial institution, real estate broker or sales representative to:

1. Refuse to sell, purchase, rent or lease to a person because of race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, handicap, marital status, sexual preference, sex, age, or place of birth.
2. To discriminate against a person in the terms, conditions or privileges of the sale, purchase, rental or lease of any housing accommodation.

A complete copy of the City's fair housing ordinance may be obtained at City Hall or by calling (414) 228-1705.

Any person who has a complaint, or who may be aggrieved by any unlawful practice which is prohibited by the ordinance, may file a complaint with the Common Council within 30 days after the aggrieved person becomes aware of the alleged unlawful practice, but no more than 60 days after the alleged unlawful practice has occurred.

The City will attempt to resolve each complaint. If an acceptable resolution for both parties is not reached, the City will then forward the complaint and findings to appropriate state and federal agencies.

In addition to the local Code of Ordinances, an individual can pursue complaints under both state and federal fair housing laws. Under the Wisconsin Open Housing Law a person has one year after the last act of discrimination to file an administrative complaint with the State of Wisconsin Equal Rights Division (ERD) and one year to file a judicial complaint (lawsuit). If a person chooses to pursue a complaint through a federal administrative agency the complaint must be filed with the Department of Housing and Urban Development

(HUD) within one year of the last act of discrimination under the 1968 Federal Fair Housing Act (FFHA). To file a federal court action under the FFHA one must file the complaint within two years of the act of discrimination. In addition, under the Civil Rights Act of 1866, which only applies to racial discrimination, a person has up to three years to file a judicial complaint.
