Sewer Repairs Scheduled for 2011

Due to the experiences the City had due to the record amount of rain in July, the proposed Capital Improvement budget for 2011, as well as, the five year Capital Budget, has been extensively revised to meet the needs of those areas most affected by this natural disaster.

The City, working with MMSD, will begin a very comprehensive private property sewer repair program for the next five years. Private sanitary laterals will be inspected and repaired as may be necessary. For homes constructed prior to 1954, the footing and foundation drain tiles will be disconnected from the sanitary sewer and connected into new sump pumps. Finally, backflow preventers will be installed to minimize, if not eliminate, sanitary sewer backups.

The program will be funded by \$850,000 in City funds, \$410,000 from MMSD, and \$130,000 in special assessments on homeowners who choose to participate. It is estimated that each home could cost \$20,000 for all of the repairs. The homeowners would be assessed 10% or \$2,000. It is estimated that 65 to 70 homes could be repaired in each of the 5 years of the program. Depending on funding and success of the program, it could be expanded beyond the initial 5 year period.

Specific priority target areas have been identified for this program. They are (in order of priority):

- 1) Ten homes on North Lydell Avenue, north of West Hampton Avenue and south of West Marne Avenue.
- 2) The residential area in Glendale located south of West Silver Spring Drive in the Sixth Aldermanic District.
- 3) The homes located north of West Glendale Avenue and west of I-43.
- 4) The Crestwood Subdivision located north of West Silver Spring Drive in the Sixth Aldermanic District.
- 5) The residential subdivision east of North Milwaukee River Parkway, north of West Silver Spring Drive in the Second Aldermanic District.

Additional information and funding for this program should be available for Council review and approval in late January or early February, 2011.

2011 Planned Capital Improvement Program

- Water main replacement in West Glendale Avenue from North Port Washington Road to North Elm Tree Road
- Water main replacement in North Milwaukee River Parkway from West Edward Lane to West Good Hope Road
- North Shore Library- Space Acquisition
- North Shore Central Dispatch Capital Costs
- North Alberta Court reconstruction from West Acacia Road north to the cul-de-sac
- Sanitary Sewer infiltration and inflow repairs and private property lateral repairs.
- West Civic Drive and North Green Bay Avenue Traffic Signals
- West Henry Clay and North Port Washington Road Traffic Signals and Street Lighting Cabinet
- Street Overlays (North Seneca Avenue, north of West Green Tree Road; West Green Tree Road, west of North Milwaukee River Parkway; West Lexington Boulevard, west of North Port Washington Road).

2011 City Budget Summary

2010 will be remembered by many people as the year of the record rain fall in July, and the subsequent flood related damage to residential properties, several businesses and particularly Nicolet High School. For many people, it will be remembered as a continuation of the economic recession which started in 2008. Unfortunately, although the national economy appears to be improving, many people remain unemployed, facing home foreclosures, a decline in wages or health care issues. The recession continues for them. The challenge for Glendale during these times is to find the resources necessary to continue basic municipal services without any significant increase in property taxes, despite a decline in property values and an increase in many goods and services.

In preparing the 2011 budget, attention was given to the decreasing revenue picture. Revenue from the hotel room tax, State shared revenue, investment income and construction permits continue to be down from the levels the City had experienced prior to 2008. For 2011, it is being projected that non-property tax revenues may be down as much as 10% from the previous year.

With non-property tax revenues declining, expenditures are unfortunately, in many cases, increasing. The City, like all homeowners, will be facing the increased cost of electricity. For the City, that directly impacts the cost for the City's extensive street lighting system. Employee health insurance, also provided from the State of Wisconsin, will continue to increase, as well as the costs related to the Wisconsin Retirement Fund, particularly for those employees in the Police Department. Labor costs, which comprise approximately 80% of the City Operation and Maintenance budget, continue to increase and, for 2011, will be subject to collective bargaining for a new contract between the City and the Police Association.

In addition to these financial challenges, the Governor and the State Legislature have imposed a tax levy limitation for 2011. Property tax levies are not permitted to be increased by more than 3% from 2010, and/or the rate of net new construction in the community from the previous year whichever is highest. In Glendale, the net new construction increase is 1.47%, the second highest of any community in Milwaukee County. However, the City participates in the State's voluntary Expenditure Restraint Program. This more restrictive expenditure program enables the City, if it chooses to participate, to receive an annual incentive payment from the State as a reward for holding expenditures to a pre-determined level. For example, the City will receive in 2011, \$270,721 from the State due to its participation in this program. The City will continue to participate in this program in 2011.

One area that the City takes great pride in is its annual Capital Improvement Program. Projects for the 2011 Capital Improvement Program are listed on the first page of the Winter newsletter.

The 2011 budget for operations and maintenance totals \$12,729,524, an increase of \$88,319 or 1.0% over the approved 2010 budget. The total City budget without TIF but including Debt Service and Special Revenue Funds, is \$18,935,334, an increase of \$160,442, or 1.0% over 2010.

The total tax levy is \$12,057,152. The City tax rate for 2011 is \$6.83 per \$1,000 of assessed value, an increase of \$0.10, or 1.48%.

In 2010, the City tax on a typical assessed home (\$200,000) was \$1,346.00. In 2011, the City tax will be \$1,366.00, an increase of \$20.00 or 1.48%.

PROPERTY TAX COLLECTION PROCEDURE

Tax bills are being forwarded to the OWNERS of property in the City of Glendale. If you are not the owner of the property described on the bill you receive, please forward it to the owner or return it to the City Treasurer's Office. For any properties sold or titles transferred after November 1, 2010, we will make every attempt to forward current tax bills to new owners.

Procedure for sending bills directly to PROPERTY OWNERS has been adopted for the following reasons:

1. The PROPERTY OWNERS will know the amount of their current taxes.
2. The Treasurer's Office will be able to mail bills at an earlier date.
3. Those desiring double tax payments in a calendar year (for income tax purposes) are assured of prompt receipt of statements.
4. Property Owners will be able to determine amounts available for payment of real estate taxes in tax escrow accounts (where applicable).
5. This allows adequate time for the taxpayer to instruct the proper lending agency as to special requests for payment of the tax bill (e.g., prior to December 31, installment payments, etc.).

PAYMENTS MAY BE MADE TO THE TREASURER'S OFFICE IN PERSON OR BY MAIL.

If you use the mail to pay your taxes, be assured that a receipt will be mailed to you the next business day.

Please remember the PERMANENT COLLECTION RECEPTACLE located at the front entrance to City Hall. Feel free to deposit your payment attached to your tax statement. **A RECEIPT WILL BE MAILED TO YOU THE NEXT BUSINESS DAY.** The drop box may be used for all types of other payments due the City, including sewer/water bills, invoices, etc.

FULL PAYMENTS are due January 31, 2011. Installment payments are due January 31, March 31 and May 31, 2011 respectively.

The three installment plan is an option for payment of taxes. Special charges, i.e. delinquent water/sewer bills, weed cutting, street improvement charges, etc., are not eligible for the installment plan and are due January 31, 2011 along with the first installment.

All payments made on or before the due date, as well as any delinquent payments made through July 31st, are to be made to the TREASURER, CITY OF GLENDALE. Delinquent payments made after July 31st are payable to the Milwaukee County Treasurer.

MARK YOUR CALENDAR TODAY so you are not late for an installment payment. NO OTHER NOTICES WILL BE SENT.

The postmark governs the date of payment - **NOT** the date on your check.

If you are paying the bill in person and require more than a few dollars change over the amount of your taxes, refund will be made by check.

Your **CITY** tax is the only amount controlled by the Mayor and Aldermen. Any questions about this tax should be directed to the City Treasurer's Office at (414) 228-1701.

All other taxing jurisdictions control their own tax levy. Questions should be directed to each of these jurisdictions regarding their taxes.

SNOW REMOVAL PROCEDURES

Based upon the expected snowfall this season, we wish to remind you of the City's long-standing snow removal and salting policy.

Normally, the City does not plow streets unless the total accumulation of snow is 3 or more inches. Anything less is typically covered by salting operations.

Salting operations commence generally at the request of the Police Department or at the determination of the Public Works Director based upon weather conditions.

Major thoroughfares have first priority. The City does not have a "bare street" program for residential areas. In other words, for residential streets, salting is typically reserved for intersections, hills, mid-blocks and curved roadways.

As much as many people would like, it is impossible for the City to schedule snow removal times to coincide with their respective snow shoveling or snow removal from their driveways. Plowing streets inevitably will put snow on property owner's driveway approaches. There is no other way to plow snow.

If possible, all major thoroughfares will be plowed and salted by morning. Residential side streets will not be completed until the major streets are completed.

As a reminder, the City does not plow or maintain County or State highways located within Glendale. Those streets include North Green Bay Avenue north of West Good Hope Road, West Good Hope Road from North Port Washington Road west to the City limits, West Mill Road, North Milwaukee River Parkway and North Port Washington Road from West Daphne Road north to the City limits.

The City's 10-person Public Works Department will do all that is humanly possible to clear all City streets in a timely fashion. Remember, we no longer contract for City street snow removal. All snow plowing, with the exception of alleys, is done by Public Works employees.

Property owners who have sidewalks will receive a reminder notice of their responsibility to remove snow and ice from their sidewalks. The City is responsible for snow removal on sidewalks that are located adjacent to or on bridges, railroad right-of-ways, and by agreement with Milwaukee County, the sidewalk on North Green Bay Avenue from West Mill Road north to West Green Tree Road.

Please have the same amount of patience and understanding required in this type of climate, with the Public Works Department.

BRUSH AND YARD WASTE COLLECTION FOR 2011

Veolia Environmental Services (the City's refuse collector) will collect brush and yard waste every other week from March 28 through November 18, 2011 (see calendar schedule on page 6). Residents who need to dispose of brush or yard waste in the winter months can schedule a pick-up from Veolia for a fee. The cost is \$30.00 for two cubic yards and \$10.00 for any additional cubic yards. (Note: One yard of yard waste equals one (1) trash can). To schedule a pick-up and make payment arrangements, call Veolia Customer Service at (262) 679-0860.

Winter Parking Regulations

Glendale's winter parking regulations take effect on December 1, 2010. No parking is allowed on any street between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. from December 1 through March 31. All 2010 parking permits will expire on December 1, 2010. If you have an emergency parking consideration, please call (414) 228-1753 with your request.



UNDERSTANDING PROPERTY ASSESSMENTS

The use of the term "Estimated Fair Market Value" on your property tax bill is mandated by state law, though it is something of a misnomer. This figure is derived from the application of a ratio determined by the Department of Revenue in their process of "equalizing" values. It is not the result of a current market analysis.

Because assessors in different taxing districts value property at different percentages of market value, the Department of Revenue converts the assessed values, by district, to a uniform level called equalized value. Equalized values are used for apportioning state and county property taxes, public school taxes, vocational school taxes, and for distributing property tax relief. While the historical sales and economic activity they analyze can be quite out-of-date with current realities, the process still works for this purpose because it is applied uniformly throughout the state.

It is the assessed value that is important for maintaining equity among individual taxpayers within each municipality. The assessed value is the value placed on taxable property by the local assessor, and is used to distribute the tax levy among the individual property owners within the municipality.

Wisconsin law recognizes that every municipality cannot be assessed exactly at market value each year. It therefore requires each municipality to assess property within ten percent of full value at least once every five years. Whether property in a municipality is assessed at 90% of market value or 110% of market value has no effect on your particular tax bill so long as your neighbors are also being assessed at that same 90% or 110%. This is the concept of uniformity and the basis for Wisconsin tax law.

Inequities can impact assessments over time due to the fact that community-wide inflation and/or deflation in property values tend not to be uniform. Therefore, the City of Glendale will be conducting a city-wide revaluation that will be based on full market value as of January 1, 2011. All property owners will be notified of their new assessment by first-class mail later this summer.

The goal is to achieve equitable valuations and to comply with State law, not to raise revenue. The tax levy is established independently by the state, county, municipality, school districts, and sewer district, to cover their expenses. The total tax levy is then divided among all owners in proportion to the amount of property they own. While an assessment change may affect your property's share of the levy, it will not change the total amount of tax dollars collected.

It's Not Too Late to Vaccinate!

If you have not had your flu shot, it's not too late. You can get either the nasal mist or injectable vaccine at one of the three monthly Immunization Clinics, or you can call the North Shore Health Department at (414) 371-2980 for an appointment. The cost is \$30.00 for injectable, \$35.00 for adult nasal mist, or \$10.00 for children. The Health Department can bill Medicare Part B for those who have this as their principal insurance.

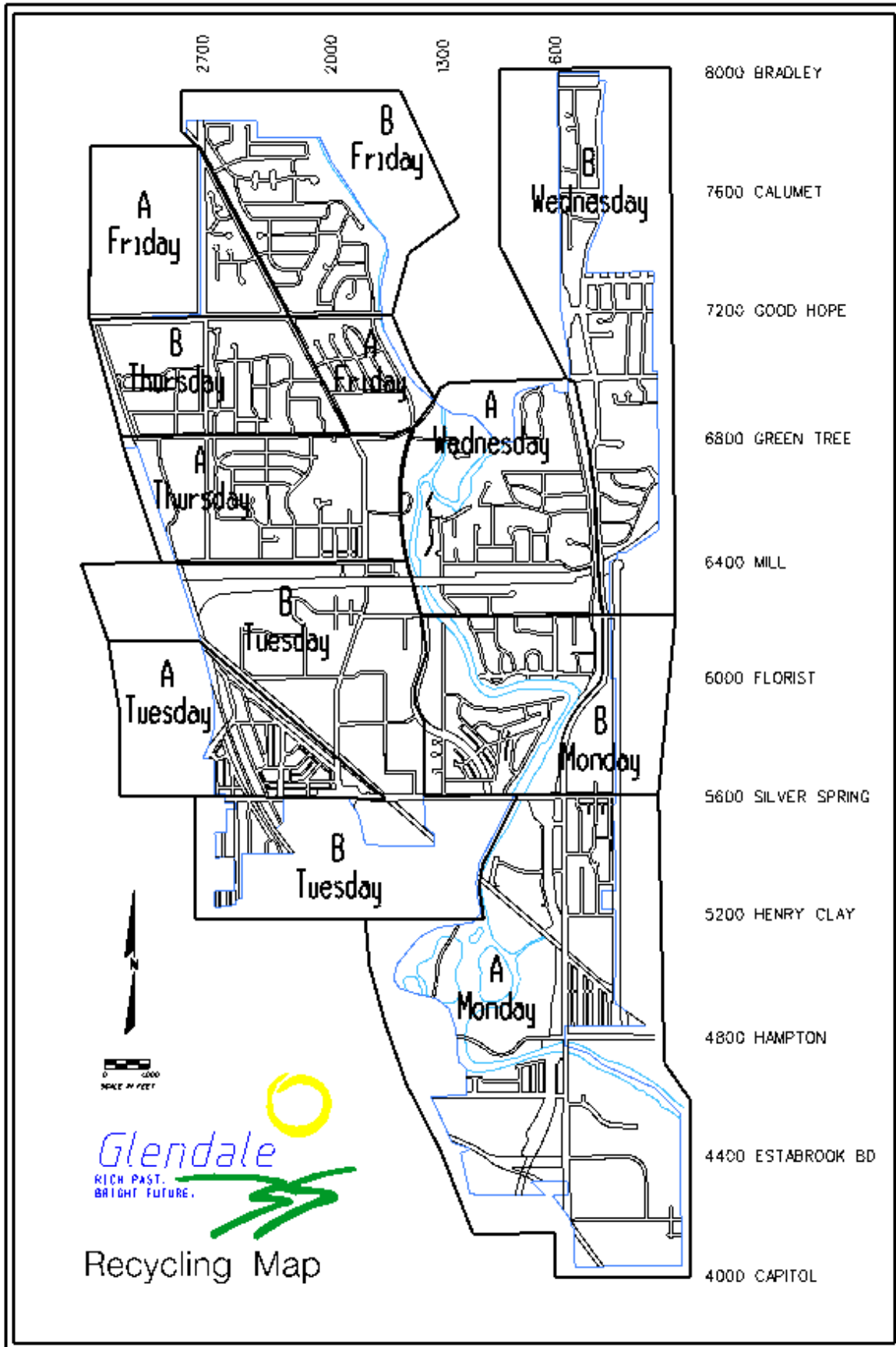

CHRISTMAS TREES

Place out with your trash on your **regular collection day**. Trees longer than 6 feet must be cut in half. The **last pick-up day** will be January 28, 2011. Place trees in the same location as your garbage and keep clear of snow banks.



Income Tax Reminder

Remember that each citizen should use **GLENDAL, WISCONSIN 53209** (west of river) or 53217 (east of river) as their mailing address. This is important when filing Income Tax Returns, Auto and Truck License Registration Forms and Application for Property Fire Insurance, as the City receives a portion of the amount you paid as "Shared Taxes." By adding Glendale, you will avoid paying a \$20.00 per vehicle wheel tax to the City of Milwaukee.

The City receives this "shared tax" payment **ONLY** if you indicate your residence as **GLENDAL**. A very significant share of your City Government is paid by "Shared Taxes."

Holiday Trash Collection

Veolia Environmental Services will be on the regular trash collection schedule throughout the holidays.

As a reminder, residents should place garbage cans at a safe distance up the driveway during the snow season so the cans are not hit by snowplows or snowload from the plows during plowing operations. Any garbage cans that are placed in the road may be hit and it will be the responsibility of the homeowner to replace if damaged.

DOG AND CAT LICENSE FEES FOR 2011

Dog and Cat License renewals for 2011 will be mailed by the Milwaukee Area Domestic Animal Control Commission (MADACC) in December. All dogs and cats over five months old are required to be licensed. A total of no more than three dogs or cats per residence are legal without first obtaining a kennel license.

Department of Public Works Yard Drop-Off

City of Glendale residents may drop off flattened cardboard and used motor oil at the Department of Public Works (DPW) yard from 7:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. Enter the yard from North Glen Park Road on the north end of the DPW building.

SIDEWALK SNOW REMOVAL

All property owners are required to fully clear all public sidewalks and handicap ramps of snow and ice within 24 hours after a snowfall.



Sidewalks and ramps must be free of snow and ice at all times. Failure to properly clear and maintain any sidewalk or handicap ramp in a safe manner will result in clearing by the City with all costs and fees charged to the property owner.

Adopt a Fire Hydrant

As winter approaches, help the North Shore Fire Department by adopting the fire hydrant closest to your home or business and keep it free of snow.

At a fire, the Fire Department must quickly locate and gain a water supply source from the closest fire hydrant. A fire engine carries enough water for approximately 3 1/2 minutes of firefighting. If a fire hydrant is buried by snow, it is difficult to find and valuable time must be spent digging it out. The delay in gaining a water supply from a fire hydrant may cause firefighters to abandon firefighting efforts and may allow a fire to grow.

Keep the snow clear from around the fire hydrant and shovel a path from the street or roadway up to the fire hydrant. These actions will allow the Fire Department to quickly locate a fire hydrant and obtain a water supply for firefighting activities.
