

Kletzsch Park River Access and Fish Passage Project

Public Information Meeting



Fish Passage, Dam Repair, Public Access and Safe Portage. Milwaukee County Parks, in partnership with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, is exploring ideas for fish passage around the Kletzsch Park dam. The proposed fish passage would allow native fish species such as northern pike and lake sturgeon to move upstream. This important river restoration project is part of a larger initiative to improve the health of Milwaukee's rivers within the Milwaukee Estuary Area of Concern.

Milwaukee County Parks is also considering enhancing the popular viewing area along the Milwaukee River Parkway with an overlook, a portage for paddlers, and an accessible walkway to the river. Necessary, minor repairs to the dam will also be completed as part of this project.

Join us for a presentation and discussion to learn how each part of this project could make this beloved park even better, from helping improve native fish populations and water quality to allowing more community members to enjoy this beautiful public space.
